But you must never eat any meat that still has the lifeblood [life] in it. Genesis 9:4.

Power in the **Blood of Jesus**

Saves from God's Wrath/Judgment (Justification):

Romans 5:9: "Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him."





Saves from the **Power and Penalty of Sin** (Redemption & Forgiveness):

Ephesians 1:7: "In Him we have **redemption through His blood**, the **forgiveness of sins**, according to the riches of His grace."

Saves from the **Defilement of Sin (Cleansing & Purification)**:

1 John 1:7: "But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin."



Saves from Spiritual Enemies (Overcoming Evil):

Revelation 12:11: "And they **overcame him** [Satan] by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death."

Saves from Alienation from God (Reconciliation & Access):

Ephesians 2:13: "But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been made near by the blood of Christ."
